



FISHING DESCRIPTION

The fishing is done primarily using the same techniques as in the American West, with comparable fly patterns and presentation that most North American anglers are accustomed to. Fisherman have the luxury of choosing specifically what rivers to be fished everyday. We offer over 8 rivers, 3 spring creeks, and 5 lakes, of which over 80 miles of river and one lake is exclusive access to Esquel Outfitters. You will depart on wading or float trips everyday from either a lodge, private estancia, camping, or rustic cabanas after breakfast around 9 AM. You will fish the entire day, only breaking for lunch and a siesta.

Your fishing trip is completely designed and based on the length of your itinerary, style of fishing, and what species you want to target. From walk and wade trips, day long floats, lake fishing, spring creeks, and camping floating trips, we can customize an itinerary for all your wants and needs. You could spend years fishing the area and still not see all of the waters available. Rivers such as the Rivadavia, Chubut, Carrileufu, Rio Grande, Gualjaina, Frey, and Rio Pico are just a few of the fine waters you have to choose from.

All of our guides are Argentine, and the hardest working, knowledgeable, and enjoyable guides in the business. NON FISHING ACTIVITIES

Flyfishing is the predominant activity for Esquel Outfitters guests.
