



SERVICES

Laundry:

Laundry service is available at the lodges and is free of charge. The lodge will need one full day in order to clean, dry, and press your clothes. Because most trips only keep you in one lodge for a maximum of 3 days, make sure you notify your guides ahead of time that you will need laundry services. Please pack accordingly.

Phone:

The lodge does have a land line available for guests to call the United States. Please know that you must have an International calling card in order to make these calls. The guides can assist you in purchasing a calling card at anytime. The local cards are much more cost effective than any cards purchased in the states. The average call runs about 20 cents a minute. Family members are welcome to contact guests at the lodge phone number below. Please be patient if a non-English speaking person answers the phone. In case of emergency we recommend calling several of the numbers below until you reach someone with the message. We also have a satellite phone that will be available on the camping/floating trips. It is meant for emergencies only, but in the case you should need to use it personally, it is \$5.00/minute.

Tipping:

Tipping is a personal decision based on service. Normally guides and staff are tipped upon departure in accordance to help rendered. Gratuities are of course earned, and not expected. A good guideline for a happy guest is approximately 7 - 10% of the trip cost per person/per week to your guide. Gratuities should be given directly to your guide on your departure day or at the conclusion of your last day of fishing. We also recommend a small gratuity for the staff and maid service at the lodge. Approximately \$40 - \$50 per week is more than adequate. Please plan to pay all tips in cash. They are very comfortable and dry extremely quickly. These clothes can also be worn around the lodge in the evening or on your travel days.

Insulation

Fleece vests, pullovers, and jackets are the key to staying warm. Again, wear synthetic materials rather than wool or cotton as they dry quickly and wick moisture away from your body. Wearing fleece pants underneath your waders will ensure that you are toasty.
